

The GPH Neurodiversity Assessment Service (NAS) is a low-cost service dedicated to providing accessible and affordable Autism, ADHD and Cognitive assessments for people of any age, but with a focus on children and young adults.

Our assessments are tailored to each person. We aim to provide you and your family or carer with an understanding of your unique support needs, which may in some circumstances support applications for funding.

Who is eligible?

NAS is available to anyone aged 6 years and over who has speaking language skills.

Fees

There are fees to access this service. GPH has kept these as low as possible. Visit our website for further details.

If you have a referral from a paediatrician, psychiatrist, or a GP you may be eligible for some subsidies through Medicare to assist in the cost of the recommended assessment/s. Please contact us for a copy of our NAS fees and payment schedule.

Assessment Services Available

Our service commences with an initial appointment to complete a needs assessment.

During this meeting, we work with you to confirm if NAS is the right service for you and to identify the assessments that best match your particular needs.

NAS currently consists of 3 assessment options which all use evidence-based assessment tools:

Autism assessment

Clinical interview with parents or carer (ADI-R) and structured assessment with the consumer (ADOS).

Cognitive Assessment

Structured assessment (WISC-V or WAIS-IV) with consumer and an assessment of functioning (ABAS-2) for parents or carer.

ADHD Assessment

Structured clinical assessment with young person and parents/carers (DIVA-5)

After you have completed the recommended assessments, your clinician will provide you with feedback and recommendations at a post-assessment consultation. You will also receive an assessment report. In some circumstances we might recommend further assessment by related health professionals, such as a psychiatrist or a paediatrician.

Brief Intake Phone Call

- 15-30 min phone call
- Screening Questionnaires may be provided to complete

Comprehensive Needs Assessment

- 1-2 hour session
- Sessions available via telehealth or in person

Explore treatment & support options

Alternative treatment and support recommendations if further assessment is not required.

Autism Assessment

- 2 sessions (1-2 hours each)
- 1st session available in person or via telehealth
- 2nd session available in person only

Cognitive Assessment

- 2 sessions (1-2 hours each)
- 1st session available in person or via telehealth
- 2nd session available in person only

ADHD Assessment

- 1 session (1-2 hours)
- Available in person or via telehealth
- Ideally, NAS will also make contact with school

Post Assessment Consultation

- 1 hour session
- Sessions available via telehealth or in person

Follow-up Check In
Optional 15-30 min (free) phone call to provide further support guidance.
